## <u>Unit 7</u>

- *Analyzing word structure*: Root words, affixes
- *Connecting ideas*: Specialized prepositions, connectors, prepositions of time, correlative conjunctions
- *Describing actions*: Verbs, synonyms, past perfect tense verbs, conditional form, modals
- *Describing how:* Adverbs
- *Describing how and to what degree:* Well vs. good; too + adverb
- Describing how many or how much: Quantifiers
- *Describing people and things*: Adjectives, figurative language
- Describing people, things, and events of the past: Statements with there was/there were

- *Describing what kind*: Adjectives, synonyms, antonyms, adjectives with –ish, adjectives with *too*, adjectives with –y
- *Expressing ideas:* Figurative language—less obvious idioms
- Identifying actions: Gerunds
- *Naming people, places, things*: Content area abstract nouns, antonyms, synonyms
- Renaming people, places, and things: Regular, indefinite, reciprocal, and reflexive pronouns
- Stating information based on text: Compound sentences joining two independent clauses and statements with there will be/there has been
- Using context clues to determine meaning: Homonyms
- Using figurative language: Similes
